



Top Five Facts

Residents Need to Know about their Townships During the COVID-19 Outbreak:

1

Townships are considered essential and are exempt from stay-at-home orders, but are urged by the commonwealth to appropriately balance public health and safety while ensuring the continued delivery of critical services and functions.

For everyone's safety township buildings may be closed to the public or available by appointment only. Staff may also be working remotely or on an as needed basis. Contact your township directly for specific information should you need immediate assistance.

Township officials are assisting in the enforcement effort of the Governor's order closing all non-life sustaining local businesses. To report noncompliance, contact your local law enforcement agency's non-emergency number. Do not call 911!

4

Townships are permitted to hold their monthly public meetings remotely. Social distancing must be practiced and public participation will be made available to the greatest extent possible. Call your township or check their website or social media pages for additional information.

5

Payment and filing deadlines for the state personal income tax and local earned income taxes were extended until July 15. Real estate tax deadlines currently remain unchanged but local government may alter, or waive late filing penalties.
